### DISCOVERY COAST NEWSLETTER NO 1

Congratulations must go to New South Wales on running a successful National Championships in Harington. Congratulations also to the New South Wales teams that were very dominant; they are very difficult to beat in their own territory. However, Queensland did make a little dent in the Rock & Beach events and South Australia made their presence felt in the casting.

The weather wasn't the best we have ever had, and it is not what was ordered for the occasion. We had a couple of hiccups along the way, but these things happen in the best of organised families. Enough about yesterday, and more about what is coming up in the future - the 36<sup>th</sup> National Angling Championships on the Discovery Coast.

No matter how organised you seem to be, there is always something that slips your mind and you remember after you get home. I meant to hand out "Intention to Attend" forms, so that I can get email addresses and send the newsletters directly to those contemplating coming to the next Carnival. We intend putting out several newsletters as things come to hand to keep people informed. I don't know how we will get across to everybody with the first one, but we will form a database as names come to hand, and that way we can email them to you. I still have a number of friends without a computer, so we will have to find another way to get to them.

We will include an "Intention to Attend" form with each newsletter and if you fill that out now, we can send you a newsletter when they come out, but we do not want the money at this stage. We would prefer the money be paid around May/June 2020.

Queensland will be holding their state titles from the 7 to 14 September and all are welcome to participate. It would give people a chance to look around and see what we banana benders do. But I warn you, we do some different types of fishing. The events are Light Gear (land based in a restricted estuarine area), Offshore, Casting, Freshwater, Boat Estuary (from boat only) and Rock & Beach.

The Annual General and Federal Executive Meetings of AAA will be held at Sandcastles 1770 Motel and Resort (on the road to 1770) - just up from the shopping centre, on Friday, 6 September. We will do a tour of the venues for 2020 on Thursday, 5 September, leaving from Sandcastles at 8.30 am. I will give more reminders before this happens. The Manager of Sandcastles has said they will give a 10% discount for longer than a few days stay and this

percentage will increase the longer you stay. They also have a variety of accommodation available, not just the motel, with room for your car and boat!

#### QUESTION ABOUT BAIT –

While we were having supper at our Queensland night presentation in Harrington, I was asked if worms available on the Discovery Coast. The answer is ‘yes’, but nobody is currently pulling worms for sale, because they are fairly scarce on the beaches around the area. I believe there are what we call blood worms available, which you may get in the soft mud beside the mangroves, but I don't know in what numbers or exactly where.

The Agnes Water Bait and Tackle sells salted worms that apparently come from Fraser Is and Tony, the proprietor, tells me they get great results using them. Usual, we would get live worms brought in from Moreton Bay; however, I'm sure you have all heard of the problem we currently have with white spot disease; and no worms, prawns, yabbies, etc can be transported or used outside the Moreton Bay area for fear of spreading the disease. But we can guarantee there are plenty of salted worms available!

While I was at the bait shop I took my time to take a look around and found it very well stocked, with the bait well presented and looking fresh. Tony told me that anybody fishing the titles will get a 10% discount on their purchases provided they show a registration card. The following bait was available -Squid in varying quantities 200 g, 500 g, 1 kg, 2 kg, 2.5 kg; Pilchards - IQF 400 g, 1 kg, 4 kg, 15 kg; and 2 kg in blocks frozen; Mullet whole, small pre packed fillets - 1 kg pack, 7 kg pack, and mullet heads; Gar 1 kg large, 400 g medium; White pilchards; small prawns; large prawns; pipis; Slimy mackerel; Salted worms; Bonito; 1 kg Yakka.

#### HEADQUARTERS

We also had a great breakfast with two lovely ladies from the Discovery Coast Sport and Recreation Club, which will be our headquarters for the Championships. They were only too pleased to help out in any way they could. Now, if we have any problems, they will look for ways to solve them. The HQ is out of the way slightly, but has plenty of parking for cars and boats. It is

a small club where you will **not** have to purchase a membership, but you will get all you need to eat and drink.

I am pretty positive there will be no travelling for the casting, as by the time the carnival comes around, we will have enough courts up and running to hold the event at headquarters. While we intend to hold the opening Welcome night at HQ, we will hold the final presentation dinner at the hall in the Community Centre in town.
